<u>Senate Democratic Majority Re-elects Senator Andrea Stewart-Cousins for 2025-26</u> <u>Legislative Session</u>

Anthem Blue Cross Blue Shield Reverses Decision To Put A Time Limit On Anesthesia Coverage

Yesterday, Anthem Blue Cross Blue Shield announced a reversal of their widely panned plan to limit coverage of anesthesia services. This plan would have impacted New Yorkers enrolled in the company's health plans, in addition to Anthem enrollees in Connecticut and Missouri starting February 1st. Under the new payment policy, Anthem said it would not pay for anesthesia services beyond the expected length of time for a given surgery or procedure.

Anesthesiologists helped spread word of the forthcoming change over the last few weeks and strongly advocated for the reversal of the policy Dr. Gal, economics committee chair of the American Society for Anesthesiologists said, "It's incomprehensible how a health insurance company could so blatantly continue to prioritize their profits over safe patient care,".

Governor Kathy Hochul called the insurer's move "outrageous" in a Wednesday night post on the social media platform X and late Thursday announced that New York had "pushed Anthem to reverse course."

In addition to the Governor a number of other prominent NY legislators voiced their outrage at the proposed policy, including Assemblymember Bichotte Hermelyn, Assemblymember Solages, and Senate Deputy Majority Leader Michael Gianaris, among others.

Senator Gianaris said he is pursuing legislation to require anesthesia coverage for procedures' full duration. "This policy is a perfect example of why people resent insurance companies, who too often are more concerned about increasing profits than servicing customers who desperately need care," Senator Gianaris said in a statement on Anthem's original plan.

DFS Issues Proposed Rule Making Regarding Identification of Disparities in Quality and Utilization of Care by Underrepresented Populations

On December 4, 2024, the Department of Financial Services (DFS) published a Proposed Rule Making in the <u>State Register</u> related to Minimum Standards for the Form, Content and Sale of Health Insurance, Including Standards of Full and Fair Disclosure. The purpose of the rule is to identify disparities in quality and utilization of care experienced by underrepresented populations. Please find the proposed rulemaking on page 7 linked <u>here</u>.

The proposed rule requires insurers licensed to write accident and health insurance in New York State, corporations organized pursuant to Insurance Law Article 43, health maintenance organizations certified pursuant to Public Health Law Article 44, and student health plans certified pursuant to Insurance Law Section 1124 (collectively, "insurers") to ask applicants applying for, or insureds currently insured under, a comprehensive health insurance policy questions regarding their race, ethnicity, preferred language, sexual orientation, and gender identity or expression.

According to the rule, requiring the systematic collection of such demographic data will help enable the Department of Financial Services and insurers to identify disparities that exist in the quality and utilization of care experienced by underrepresented populations and inform data-driven public policymaking.


